CONTEST GUIDELINES

- Open to students who live in the City of Inglewood or attend an Inglewood public, private or charter school or church.
- Speeches are to be written and delivered by students.
- Speeches must follow the theme: *“Dream with a Vision. Live with a Purpose..”*
- Speech must be delivered within the length of time allotted per grade level.
- All speeches (winner and alternates) for schools and churches must be submitted to the City by the school principal or church pastor no later than **December 1, 2015.**

CONTEST AT-A-GLANCE

- Speech contest winners from the schools and churches will be notified by a City representative via telephone and in writing of the date and time of their final interview by the Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Speech Contest Committee.
- Final judging by the Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Speech Contest Committee will take place from December 10-12, 2015.
- Contestants ***must memorize*** their speech for presentation to the judging panel.
- A winner from each grade category will be selected to receive a cash prize and certificate of recognition.
- The winners of each grade level category will present their speech at the City’s **33rd Annual MLK Day Celebration, Monday, January 18, 2016.**
